- Non-Involvement of women in politics






Achievement

- Founder of Abeokuta ladies club in 1944 (renamed Abeokuta Women's Union): a group committed to defending women's political, social and economic rights which became one of the most important movements in the 20th century
- She became the first woman to drive a car in Nigeria
- She founded one of first kindergartens and started giving courses to unprivileged and market women
- Active Role in pre-independence constitutional negotiation in 1946
- Winner of the Lenin peace prize.
- Treasurer and President Western Women Association of the national council of Nigeria and the Cameroons.
- One of the Women elected to the native house of chiefs, serving as an Oloye (Knight) of the Yoruba people
